AMENDING BALLINGER'S CODE RELATIVE TO COSTS IN JUSTICE COURTS.

AN ACT amending Section 6561 of Ballinger's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Washington, same being Section 2904 of Pierce's Washington Code, relating to security for costs in Justice Courts.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Section I. That Section 6561 of Ballinger's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Washington, same being Section 2904 of Pierce's Washington Code, be and the same is, hereby amended to read as follows: Section 6561. Whenever the plaintiff is a non-resident of the County, the Justice may require of him security for the costs in a sum not exceeding fifty dollars at the time of the commencement of the action. *Provided*, however, That after an action has been commenced by a non-resident plaintiff and no security given for costs, the defendant may require such security by motion; when allowed all procedings shall be stayed until such security has been given.
