

sioners of any county may at any time remove said sheep inspector from office, and declare the said office vacant, without a hearing or without assigning any cause therefor, for such reasons alone as may cause them to deem it expedient to act in the premises; *Provided, further,* That all of the powers in this act conferred upon the board of county commissioners are also hereby conferred upon the State Veterinarian; and in the event that the board of county commissioners of any county shall fail or neglect to appoint a sheep inspector as herein provided, it shall thereupon become the duty of the State Veterinarian to make such appointment, and the person so appointed shall hold office for the time designated herein, and be clothed with all the powers in this act provided. And *provided, further,* That the inspector so appointed shall serve without compensation.

FISH HATCHERY ON OUTLET OF TROUT LAKE.

AN ACT to establish and maintain a state fish hatchery on the outlet of Trout lake in Island county, Washington.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That the State Fish Commissioner is hereby authorized and empowered, and it is hereby made his duty, to establish and maintain a state fish hatchery on the outlet of Trout Lake in section 21, in township 29 north, of range 3 east, Willamette Meridian, in Island county, Washington: *Provided,* That said outlet is suitable for the hatching of salmon.

Fish Commissioner may establish.
