EMPLOYMENT OF COUNTY PRISONERS ON ROADS.

AN ACT relating to the duty of county commissioners in regard to prisoners in county jails and authorizing the employment of such prisoners.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. The board of county commissioners of any county, may in their discretion, order the sheriff to cause all persons under sentence of imprisonment in the county jail, except females and persons incapable of performing manual labor, to be put to work and perform labor on the public roads and highways within such counties. Work on highways.

SEC. 2. All work done by prisoners as herein provided shall be under the direction of the county commissioners: Supervision of work.
Provided, That when the work is done on any of the roads or highways leading to and within the corporate limits of any incorporated city or town it shall be done according to the directions of the proper authorities of such city or town.

ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF TAXES IN CITIES OF THE SECOND, THIRD AND FOURTH CLASSES.

AN ACT relating to the assessment and collection of taxes in municipal corporations of the second, third, and fourth classes, and amending sections 1810 and 1814, of Ballinger's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Washington, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:
