Existing receipts.

The provisions of this act do not apply to receipts made and delivered prior to the taking effect of this act.

SEC. 60. *Inconsistent Legislation Repealed.*

Repeal.

All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 61. *Name of Act.*

"Title."

This act may be cited as the "Uniform Warehouse Receipts Act."

ABOLISHING NECESSITY OF CORROBORATIVE EVIDENCE IN RAPE, SEDUCTION, ETC.

AN ACT repealing section 2443 of Remington & Ballinger's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Washington, relating to the rule of evidence in the case of certain crimes against morality and decency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That section 2443 of Remington & Ballinger's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Washington, relating to the rule of evidence in the case of certain crimes against morality and decency, be repealed.
