FIXING SALARIES OF LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD.

An Act relating to intoxicating liquors, providing for the control and regulation thereof, creating state offices, defining crimes and providing penalties therefor, providing for the disposition of public funds, amending section 63, chapter 62, Laws Extraordinary Session, 1933 and declaring that this act shall take effect immediately.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Amends § 63, Ch. 62, Laws 1933, Ex. Sess. Section 1. That section 63, chapter 62, Laws of the Extraordinary Session, 1933, be amended and hereby is amended to read as follows:

Board, maximum salary. Section 63. There shall be a board, known as the "Washington State Liquor Control Board," consisting of three members, to be appointed by the governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, who shall each be paid an annual salary, to be fixed by the governor, not to exceed \$7,500.00; not more than two of whom shall belong to any one political party. The governor may, in his discretion, appoint one of the members as chairman of the board, and a majority of the members shall constitute a quorum of the board.

Effective immediately.

SEC. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, support of the state government and its existing public institutions and shall take effect immediately.
