

CHAPTER 37.

[S. B. 57.]

STATE GAME COMMISSION.

AN ACT relating to game and the appointment of a State Game Commission, and amending section 107B, chapter 7, Laws of 1921, as enacted by section 8, chapter 3, Laws of 1933; and repealing section 107C, chapter 7, Laws of 1921, as enacted by section 9, chapter 3, Laws of 1933, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. Section 107B, chapter 7, Laws of 1921, as enacted by section 8, chapter 3, Laws of 1933, is amended to read as follows: Amendments.

Section 107B. The Governor shall have the power and it shall be his duty to appoint a State Game Commission, which shall consist of six electors of the state, who shall be appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Senate and hold office at the pleasure of the Governor, at least three of whom shall be residents of that portion of the state lying east of the summit of the Cascade Mountains, and at least three of whom shall be residents of that portion of the state lying west of the summit of the Cascade Mountains, no two of whom shall be residents of the same county. State Game Commission, how appointed.

SEC. 2. Section 107C, chapter 7, Laws of 1921, as enacted by section 9, chapter 3, Laws of 1933, is hereby repealed. Amendments.

* SEC. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and for the immediate support of the state government and its existing public institutions and shall take effect immediately. Effective immediately.
