Sec. 6. Section 10, chapter 183, Laws of 1975 1st ex. sess. and RCW 75.28.540 are each amended to read as follows:

No application for participation in the program provided for in RCW 75.28.500 through 75.28.540 shall be accepted by the department later than June 30, ((1977)) 1980. The director shall provide for the expeditious completion of the program thereafter and shall notify the state legislature when such provisions might appropriately be declared null and void.

CHAPTER 231

[Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill No. 3105]
INJURY TO GOVERNMENT PROPERTY——PENALTY

AN ACT Relating to state government; amending section 1, chapter 141, Laws of 1959, and RCW 9.61.160; amending section 3, chapter 141, Laws of 1959 and RCW 9.61.180; prescribing penalties; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Section 1. Section 1, chapter 141, Laws of 1959 and RCW 9.61.160 are each amended to read as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person to threaten to bomb or otherwise injure any public or private school building, <u>any</u> place of worship or public assembly, <u>any governmental property</u>, or any other building, common carrier, <u>or</u> structure, or <u>any place</u> used for human occupancy; or to communicate or repeat any information concerning such a threatened bombing or injury, knowing such information to be false and with intent to alarm the person or persons to whom the information is communicated or repeated.

Sec. 2. Section 3, chapter 141, Laws of 1959 and RCW 9.61.180 are each amended to read as follows:

Any violation of RCW 9.61.160 through 9.61.180 shall be a ((gross misdemeanor)) felony.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, the support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately.
