## CHAPTER 333

## [Substitute House Bill No. 660] PRIVATE CARRIERS——DRIVER QUALIFICATIONS AND HOURS OF SERVICE STANDARDS

AN ACT Relating to private carriers; adding a new chapter to Title 46 RCW; and prescribing penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The Washington state patrol may adopt rules establishing standards for qualifications and hours of service of drivers for private carriers as defined by RCW 81.80.010(6). Such standards shall correlate with and, as far as reasonable, conform to the regulations contained in Title 49 C.F.R., Chapter 3, Subchapter B, Parts 391 and 395, on the effective date of this act. At least thirty days before filing notice of the proposed rules with the code reviser, the state patrol shall submit them to the legislative transportation committee for review.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The delegation of rule-making authority contained in section 1 of this act is conditioned upon the continued receipt of federal funds or grants for the support of state enforcement of such rules. Within ninety days of finding that federal funds or grants are withdrawn or not renewed, the Washington state patrol and the Washington utilities and transportation commission shall repeal any and all rules adopted under section 1 of this act.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A violation of any rule adopted by the Washington state patrol under section 1 of this act is a traffic infraction.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. Sections 1 through 3 of this act shall constitute a new chapter in Title 46 RCW.
