In providing an employer group plan under this section, the department may consider an employer group as a single employing entity for purposes of dividends or premium discounts.

MILITARY DISCHARGES—FREE RECORDATION

AN ACT Relating to recording of discharges; and amending RCW 73.04.030.

ESCROW AGENTS—LICENSE RENEWAL—EXTENSION OF TIME

AN ACT Relating to the license renewal of escrow officers; and amending RCW 18.44.310.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Sec. 1. Section 24, chapter 156, Laws of 1977 ex. sess. as amended by section 6, chapter 340, Laws of 1985 and RCW 18.44.310 are each amended to read as follows:

The license of an escrow officer shall be retained and displayed at all times by the certificated escrow agent, and when the officer ceases to represent the agent, the license shall cease to be in force. Notice of such termination shall be given by the next regular business day by the escrow agent to the director and such notice shall be accompanied by and include the surrender of the escrow officer's license.
