


Revenue Projection for FY2045

# Special registration surcharges for electric & alternative fuel vehicles



States with special fees for plug-in electric vehicles

Kansas' fees on hybrid, all-electric, and plug-in electric vehicles

- All-electric vehicles: + \$70\*
- Plug-in electric vehicles: + \$20\*
- Hybrid vehicles: + \$20

\*In addition to standard registration fees that all vehicles pay (\$30-\$40, depending on weight). Total fees capped at \$100 and \$50, respectively.

Taxing electricity used by electric vehicles




Mileage-based road usage charges (RUC)

## **Our Study – Two Phases Completed**


## Outreach

#### OCT. 2023 – DEC. 2024


- Focus: Rural, ag, trucking
- Up to 700 light, mediumduty, and heavy-duty vehicles





# Finding common ground and understanding what's unique in Kansas to design a customized pilot.





Rural residents
12 participants

- Urban residents 4 participants
- Agricultural sector 13 participants

Commercial trucking 12 participants



### What we heard.

Kansans want **simplicity**, **transparency**, **fairness**, and **choices**.

Policymakers want sustainable transportation revenue.

## What we're doing.



Include diverse vehicle types – including light, medium, and heavy vehicles (all engine-types)



Focus on rural, ag, and trucking communities



Hands-on pilot with multiple mileage reporting and payment options



RUC Estimator to help vehicle owners understand financial impact



Involve Midwest states

## **Pilot Hallmarks**



- Clear pilot objectives and process.
- Accessible and clear information.
- Straightforward explanations.
- No persuasion or influencing.
- **Predictable** RUC payments



- Clear and objective choices
- Manual or automated reporting.
- Flexible payment options.



- Accountability for all users
- Rates based on vehicles type (not vehicle-owner attributes)



## **Pilot Starting in October**



- 3-month pilot involving drivers in Kansas and the Midwest
- Final report in December 2024



**Light-Duty** 400 vehicles expected

**Medium-Duty** 50 vehicles expected

**Heavy-Duty** 50 vehicles expected







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
