Suggested Issues for November 17 agenda (as of November 9, 2005):

Information requests that follow up on presentations made by Dr. Vroman

1.
 - (a) Provide more information about industries in rate classes 38-40.
 - (b) What are the dollar amounts of ineffective charging that these industries generate?
 - (c) What is the extent of subsidization?
 - (d) What portion of ineffective charges are a result of 2 qtr. and 4 qtr. averaging -- provide this analysis under the following scenarios: (1) ESB 6097 is fully implemented and (2) EHB 2255 - 2 qtr averaging were to be permanently implemented.
2.
 - (a) What industries are at the tax cap?
 - (b) Who would be affected if the tax cap was removed and what would those tax rates be?
3. Provide information on the impact of COPES providers on the "churning" data.
4. Look at inactive accounts in Washington and their impact on socialized costs and cross-subsidization. What is the impact of SUTA dumping?
5.
 - (a) Provide an estimate of cost savings to the UI system, including the types of savings, that are still to be gained from the implementation of ESB 6097 (with EHB 2255 - 2 qtr averaging made permanent and with EHB 2255 expiring).
 - (b) Also provide projections for the same impacts on Washington's generosity index for the next 5 years.
6. Provide demographics, wage levels, industries, and occupational breakdowns for repeat claimants.
7. How does Washington's ERI change if ESB 6097 were to be fully implemented and EHB 2255 - 2 qtr averaging were to be made permanent?
8. What are the employment demographics of the claimants and industries affected using 2, 3, and 4 quarter averaging? Provide statistics on 2, 3, and 4 quarter averaging.

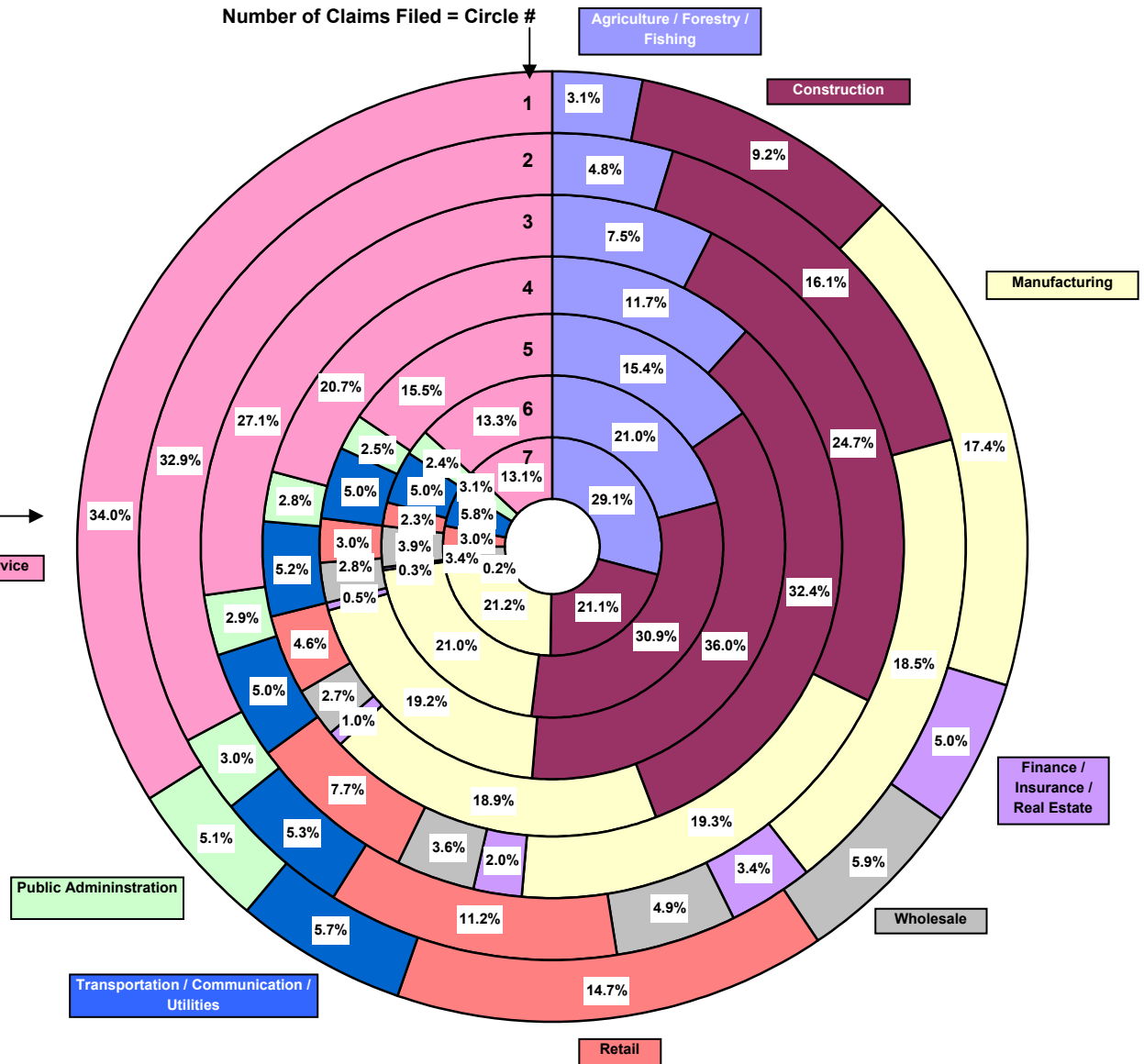

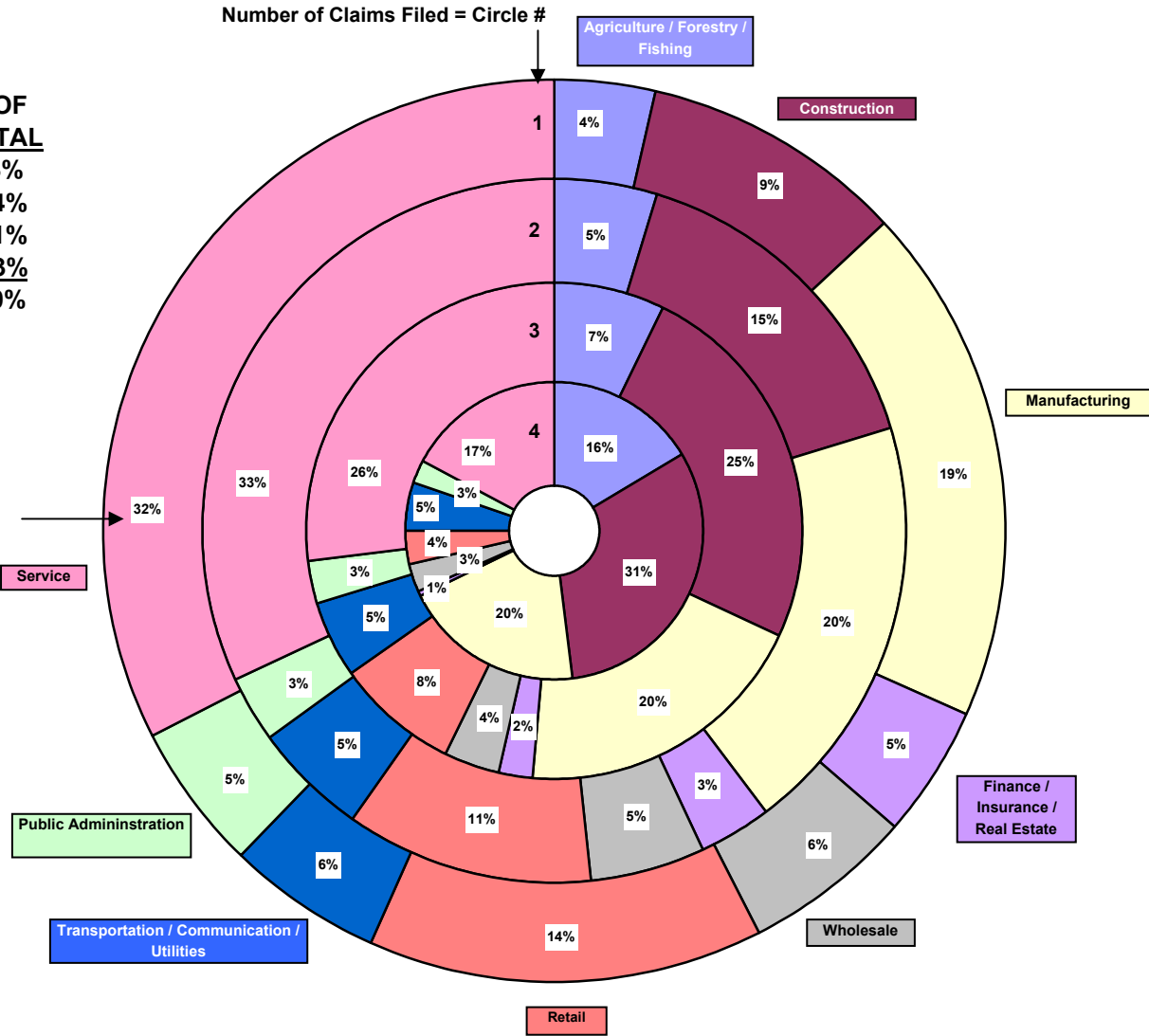
