Relevant Statute	RCW 79A.25.210; 286-30 WAC
Program Goal	To assist with the acquisition, development, and renovation of firearm and archery ranges in order to increase access by law enforcement, the public with concealed pistol or hunting licenses, and people enrolled in firearm or hunter safety education classes
Agency Summary	FARR provides grants to state and federal agencies, local governments, tribes, and other entities for projects for places where gun and bow recreationists can practice and train safely. Grant applications to the RCFB are ranked and submitted for funding consideration.
