Program Goal	To maintain a fully functional riparian management zone on rivers where the channel may migrate.
Agency Summary	RHOSP allows DNR to acquire permanent conservation easements from landowners for unconfined channel migration zones and habitat critical for state threatened or endangered species. RHOSP compensates landowners for 100% of the value of the timber they are not allowed to harvest in an area due to Forest Practices restrictions.
	RHSOP easement applications are prioritized based on the habitat quality, risk of future habitat loss, documented occupancy, species' landscape continuity, and species diversity.
Existing Outcome Measures	DNR tracks the acres acquired, number of easements, and costs.
Other benefits identified by agencies	Economy: economic benefit to landowner, maintains small forest lands Environment: Puget Sound restoration
