# Program created to achieve the goal of recycling mercury-containing lights



# The Department of Ecology oversees the program.

A private organization manages the work.

### The program is meant to:

- Establish uniform statewide requirements to recycle the lights.
- Create system to collect the lights.
- Educate the public about recycling mercury-containing lights.

Examples of mercury-containing lights include fluorescents, HIDs, and neon bulbs.



# Study mandate for the Sunset Review

- In 2014, the Mercury-Containing Lights Product Stewardship Program was added to Sunset chapter (RCW 43.131.421).
- The program will terminate July 1, 2025 if no action is taken by the Legislature.
- In calendar year before termination, JLARC is directed to review the program and recommend it be continued, modified, or allowed to terminate.

- 1. Has the program fulfilled the legislative intent to keep mercury out of the solid waste system, educate the public, and provide collection sites?
  - a) Do any disparities in access to the program exist?

- 2. Does Ecology provide for efficient and economical management of the program?
- 3. Has the program achieved its performance measures?
- 4. Does the program duplicate the activities of another agency or the private sector?
- 5. What are the possible effects of eliminating or changing the program?
