SIXTY FOURTH DAY

House Chamber, Olympia, Monday, March 17, 2025

The House was called to order at 10:30 a.m. by the Speaker (Representative Simmons presiding). The Clerk called the roll and a quorum was present.

The flags were escorted to the rostrum by a Sergeant at Arms Color Guard, Pages Arvin Minhas and Makenna Foreman. The Speaker (Representative Simmons presiding) led the Chamber in the Pledge of Allegiance. The prayer was offered by Chaplain Rob Bradley, Olympia Fire Department.

The Speaker (Representative Simmons presiding) is pleased to welcome Lieutenant Duncan MacLeod from the Tumwater Fire Department, who is a piper with Puget Sound Firefighters' Pipes and Drums. He will be performing An T-Eilean Muileach and Scotland the Brave. The band is made up of active and retired firefighters from career fire departments all around the South Puget Sound region and, like other fire service pipe bands in the state, its primary mission is to honor the lives of firefighters and law enforcement personnel whose lives have been lost in the line of duty.

Reading of the Journal of the previous day was dispensed with and it was ordered to stand approved.
