a. Chair Proposed Combined Commissioner Comments

Green Group

Preferences in the green group are preferences where the proposed comments from individual commissioners did not vary significantly.

**MOTION:** A motion was made to adopt the combined Commissioner comments in the green category. These comments endorse the Legislative Auditor's recommendations to:

- Extend and modify the preference for **Manufacturers' Deferral** (Sales and Use Tax).
- Review and consider whether to extend the preference for **Targeted Urban Area Exemption** (Local Property Tax).

### Yellow Group

Preferences in the yellow group are preferences where the proposed comments from individual Commissioners varied slightly, and the Chair's proposed comment sought to reconcile them.

**MOTION:** A motion was made to adopt the combined Commissioner comments in the yellow category that endorse the Legislative Auditor's recommendation to:
