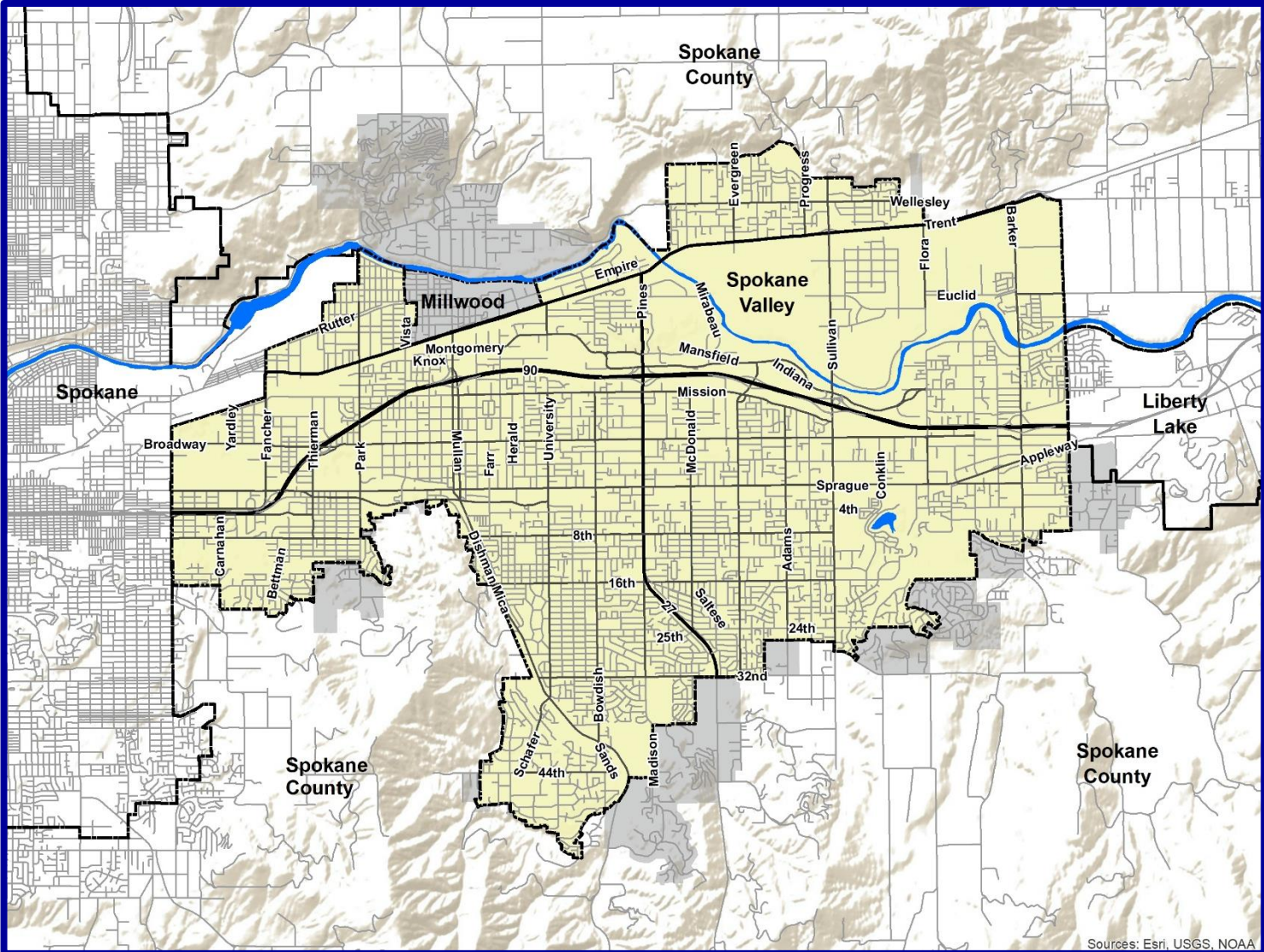

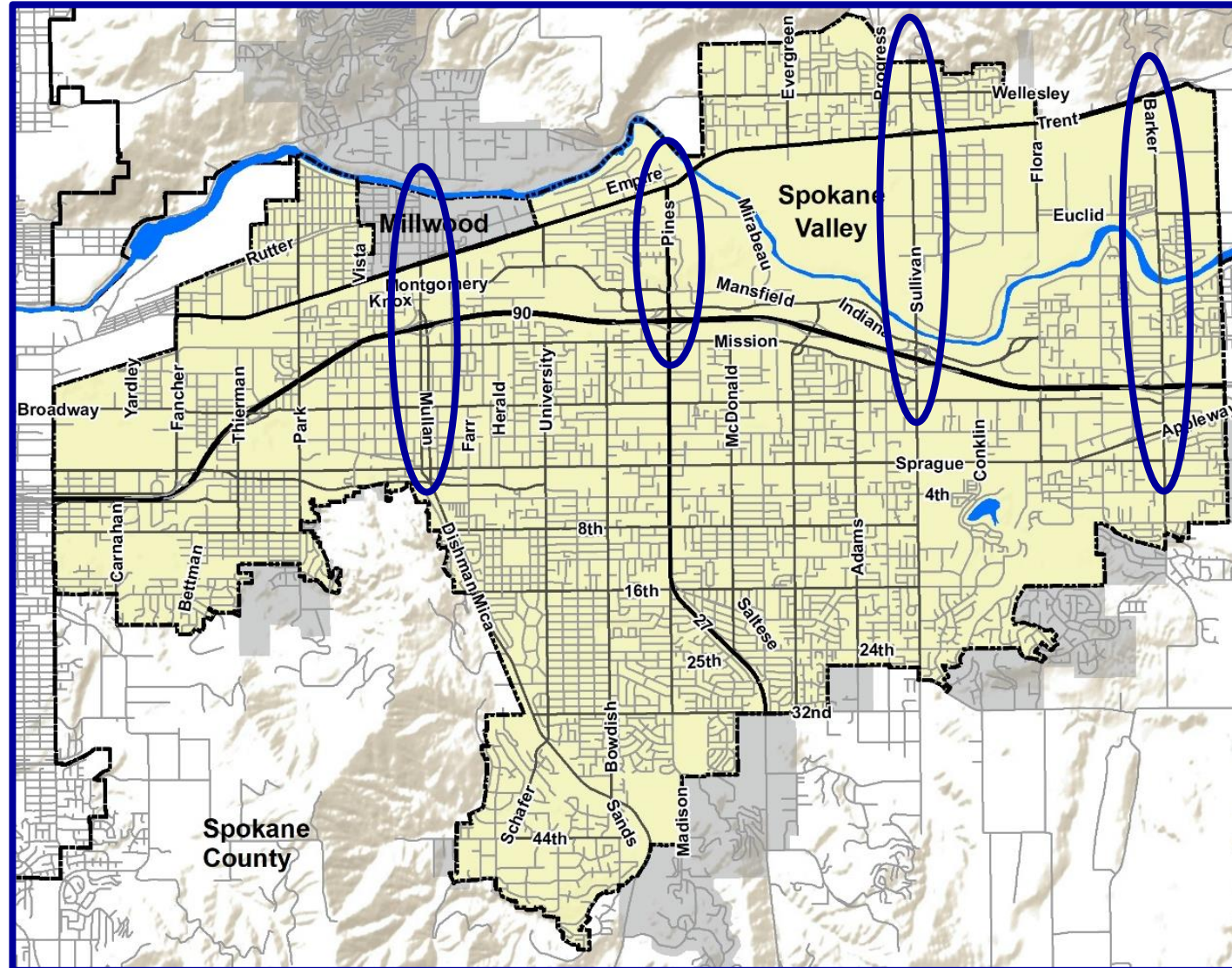
City of Spokane Valley

- Incorporated: March 31, 2003
- Population: 96,000 (10th Largest in State)
- Land Area: 39 Square Miles
- Taxable Assessed Value: \$9 Billion
- Property Tax: \$12 Million
- Sales Tax: \$25 Million
- Total Revenue: \$45 Million

SR-27/BNSF Railway Grade Separation

Key Improvements

- Replace SR-27 (Pines Rd) Railroad Crossing
- Construct Railroad Underpass
- Realigned Pines Rd Reduces School Congestion
