

## CHAPTER 13.

## INTOXICATING LIQUORS. DISPOSITION OF MONEYS.

AN ACT relating to intoxicating liquors, providing for the disposition of public funds, repealing section 76 and amending section 77 of chapter 62 of the Laws of the Extraordinary Session of 1933 of the State of Washington (sec. 7306-76 and 77, Remington's Revised Statutes), and declaring that this Act shall take effect immediately.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:*

Repeals § 76,  
ch. 62, Laws  
of 1933.

SECTION 1. That section 76 of chapter 62 of the Laws of the Extraordinary Session of 1933 (sec. 7306-76, Remington's Revised Statutes) be and the same is hereby repealed.

Amends § 77,  
ch. 62, Laws  
of 1933.

SEC. 2. That section 77 of chapter 62 of the Laws of the Extraordinary Session of 1933 (sec. 7306-77, Remington's Revised Statutes) be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Distribution  
of funds.

Section 77. Moneys in the liquor revolving fund shall be distributed by the board at least once every three months in accordance with section 78 hereof: *Provided*, That the board shall reserve from distribution such amount not exceeding \$500,000.00 as may be necessary for the proper administration of this act.

Reservation  
of funds.

Effective  
immediately.

SEC. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate support of the state government and its existing public institutions and shall take effect immediately.
