The House was called to order at 9:55 a.m. by the Speaker (Representative Shavers presiding).

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Thomas H. Gray has demonstrated an exceptional dedication to the field of aerospace engineering, leaving an indelible mark on the aviation industry through his pioneering work; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Gray, a graduate in electrical engineering from the University of New Mexico, began his distinguished career at Boeing in 1961, where he played a critical role in the flight testing of groundbreaking aircraft, including the 737, 747, 757, and 767; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Gray made history as the first nonpilot to fly aboard the 747 initial test flight on February 25, 1969, a milestone event that revolutionized modern air travel and showcased his technical expertise and commitment to innovation; and

WHEREAS, His extensive contributions to flight testing, particularly in the integration of digital and computer technology, have significantly advanced the safety, performance, and reliability of aircraft worldwide; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Gray extended his engineering talents beyond aviation to technologies that helped the Navy expand its ability to command the maritime domain, and played a pivotal role in the space shuttle Enterprise landing tests in 1977, further cementing his legacy as a versatile and forward-thinking engineer; and

WHEREAS, Outside his professional achievements, Thomas Gray has demonstrated a deep commitment to preserving aviation history and inspiring future generations through his volunteer work, amassing over 1,400 hours as a docent at the Museum of Flight since 2013; and

WHEREAS, His dedication to honoring the legacy of African American aviators through his work with the Tuskegee Airmen's Sam Bruce Chapter has helped correct historical inaccuracies and educate the public on the invaluable contributions of the Tuskegee Airmen; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Gray's mentorship and involvement in youth programs such as the Michael P. Anderson Memorial Aerospace Program and the Red-Tailed Hawks Flying Club have inspired and nurtured the aspirations of countless young people pursuing careers in aerospace; and

WHEREAS, At 87 years old, Thomas Gray continues to serve as a beacon of innovation, mentorship, and advocacy, embodying the pioneering spirit that has propelled the aerospace industry forward;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Washington State House of Representatives honor Thomas H. Gray for his extraordinary contributions to aerospace engineering, his tireless efforts to educate and inspire, and his unwavering commitment to advancing the field of engineering within the State of Washington; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be immediately transmitted by the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives to Thomas H. Gray as a token of appreciation for his remarkable achievements and lasting impact on the aerospace community.

WHEREAS, The people of Washington State share a rich cultural history and a strong bond with our global neighbors in Taiwan and the more than 100,000 Taiwanese Americans from Taiwan living and working in Washington State; and

WHEREAS, Taiwanese Americans living in Washington have profoundly impacted our state and continue to further the democratic values that define us as a beacon of opportunity and prosperity; and

WHEREAS, Washingtonians recognize the generations of resilience, sacrifice, and hope demonstrated by Taiwanese immigrants living in Washington and their descendants in their innumerable contributions to our communities; and

WHEREAS, The people of Washington State enjoy a more vibrant heritage and economy from the bilateral cultivation of these deep ties with the people of Taiwan; and

WHEREAS, In 2022, the total trade between Washington State and Taiwan exceeded approximately \$3,800,000,000 worth of products, making Taiwan the 7th largest trading partner for the State, and both sides are committed to strengthening bilateral economic ties; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan is the 6th largest export destination for United States agricultural goods, and has ranked among the top three importers of Washington sweet cherries, potatoes, and beef; and

WHEREAS, The people of Washington State value the investment of Taiwanese companies in Washington State's workforce, helping to create more than 15,000 skilled labor jobs in industries ranging from semiconductor technology, airlines, and harbor shipping to the development and manufacture of high-quality fiber optic components and video microscopes; and

WHEREAS, Washington State has resumed its office in Taiwan and appointed a representative in November of 2023 to strengthen their trade and investment relationship;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Washington State House of Representatives reiterate its support for a closer economic and trade relationship between Washington State and the people of Taiwan and recognize the importance of a strong and enduring relationship between the people of Washington State and the people of Taiwan.

WHEREAS, An estimated 54 million Americans have osteoporosis or low bone mass, and studies suggest that approximately one in two women and up to one in four men aged 50 and older will break a bone due to osteoporosis; and

WHEREAS, Osteoporosis-related bone fractures account for more hospitalizations than heart attacks, strokes, or breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, Osteoporosis is often referred to as a "silent disease" because individuals cannot feel their bones weakening; and

WHEREAS, Timely bone health screening, diagnosis, and treatment can help prevent fractures that may lead to hospitalizations and long-term nursing home stays; and

WHEREAS, Cost-effective postfracture care, which improves care coordination, has been shown to reduce the number of subsequent or repeat fractures; and

WHEREAS, Osteoporosis and the associated broken bones are not an inevitable part of aging—building strong bones begins in childhood and remains essential throughout life, with peak bone mass typically reached by early adulthood; and

WHEREAS, Optimum bone health and osteoporosis prevention can be achieved through a balanced diet rich in calcium and vitamin D, weight-bearing and muscle-strengthening exercises, and a healthy lifestyle free from smoking and excessive alcohol consumption; and

WHEREAS, Raising awareness about bone health among the public, health care professionals, and policymakers is vital to reducing the prevalence and impact of osteoporosis;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and appreciate the ideals, goals, and activities of National Bone Health and Osteoporosis Month in May; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage the observation of appropriate health programs and activities to promote bone health and the prevention of osteoporosis throughout life.
