VETERANS' BONUS.

AN ACT relating to payment of a bonus to veterans of World War II, and amending section 73.32.030, R.C.W.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. Section 73.32.030, R.C.W., as derived from section 2, chapter 180, Laws of 1949, is amended to read as follows: Amendment.

The word "person" as used in 73.32.020 shall not include persons, who during the period of their service, refused on conscientious, political or other grounds to subject themselves to full military discipline and unqualified service or who were separated from such service under conditions other than honorable, and who have not subsequently been officially restored to an honorable status, and such persons shall not be entitled to the benefits of this chapter: *Provided, however,* That the word "person" as used in 73.32.020 shall include those persons with honorable discharge who claimed exemptions from combatant training and service by reason of religious training and belief and whose claims were sustained under authority of the selective training and service act of 1940 and executive order No. 8606, but who were inducted into the armed forces and assigned to noncombatant service and who did not otherwise refuse to subject themselves to full military discipline and unqualified service. "Persons" not included.
