

CHAPTER 87.

AMENDING ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF
FISH COMMISSION.

AN ACT to amend section one of an act entitled "An act to amend sections six and seven of an act entitled 'An act for the appointment of a Fish Commission, and defining its duties, and declaring an emergency to exist,' approved February 20, 1890, relating to fish commissioner and declaring an emergency," approved March 18, 1901.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That section one of an act entitled "An Act to amend sections six and seven of an act entitled 'An Act for the appointment of a fish commission, and defining its duties, and declaring an emergency to exist,' approved February 20, 1890, relating to Fish Commissioner and declaring an emergency," approved March 18, 1901, be, and the same is, amended to read as follows: Section 1. That section six (6) of an act entitled "An Act for the appointment of a Fish Commission, and defining its duties, and declaring an emergency to exist," be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

.Salaries.

Sec. 6. The Fish Commissioner shall receive an annual salary of two thousand four hundred dollars to be paid in monthly installments by the State Treasurer, and he shall be allowed his actual expenses of travel in the performance of his duties not to exceed one thousand dollars in any one year. The deputies shall receive a salary of fifteen hundred dollars each per year to be paid in monthly installments by the State Treasurer, and they shall be allowed their actual expenses of travel in the performance of their duties, not to exceed six hundred dollars per annum each. The general superintendent of hatcheries shall receive a salary of eighteen hundred dollars per annum to be paid in monthly installments and he shall be allowed his actual expenses of travel in the performance of his duties not to exceed nine hundred dollars per annum.
