

Identify and recommend changes to the WSDOT I-90 ramps at Rainier Avenue South to improve safe travel for all modes and increase access to the Judkins Park Link light rail station via transit transfer, walking, and biking.






Interagency Context



Community Profile

- Project area: 250,000+ people; 14,000+ households
- Translation needs: Chinese, Spanish, Vietnamese
- 54% BIPOC
- 17% below federal poverty level
- 14% report a disability
- 23% of households without vehicle
- Environmental health effects affect all tracts, scoring between 8-10, indicating these communities face greater disparities
