# WELCOME TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

You are a welcome guest in what is certainly one of the nation's most beautiful capitol buildings. Its dome, of solid masonry, is the equivalent of 28 stories in height, exceeded only by the National Capitol in Washington, D. C., St. Paul's in London, and St. Peter's in Rome. It was completed in 1927 at the modest cost of about \$7 million, financed entirely through sales of state-owned timber. It would be impossible to duplicate today at any cost. The warmly tinted marble in the House Chambers was imported from Europe and fitted by skilled craftsmen. The bronze chandeliers were fashioned by Tiffany and the mahogany woodwork, including the ornately hand-carved rostrum was the work of master

Above the rostrum is the electronic roll call device, which permits each member to record his vote by the touch of a button, thus expediting the business of the House and permitting visitors to see each roll call vote tabulated almost imme-

# EARLY HISTORY OF THE LEGISLATURE

The State Constitution approved by Washington voters on October 1, 1889, limits legislative sessions to 60 days, but an exception was made for the first session of 1889. It was felt that it might take a little longer to make the transition from territorial to state government. The first State Legislature was called to order in Olympia at noon on November 6, 1889 . . . five days before statehood.

Elisha P. Ferry, a former territorial governor, was the first governor of the state. The first Speaker of the House was J. W. Feighan of Spokane County, while Lieutenant Governor Charles E. Laughton presided over the Senate. (The constitution gave the Legislature the right to abolish the office of lieutenant governor, and a bill was introduced to do just that. It was indefinitely postponed.

The first House bill introduced was not as some might have expected, to appropriate money for the Legislature. House Bill 1 was to pay "deficiencies for supplies furnished to the Hospital for the Insane at Fort Steilacoom."

In 1889 the Legislature met in the old wooden territorial capitol on the site of the present capitol campus. Washington had a population of slightly over 350,000, and the House was composed of 70 members. It did not attain its full constitutional limit of 99 members until the session of 1933. The membership was reduced to 98 just prior to this session as a result of legislative redistricting.

Shortly after the turn of the century the Legislature moved to the first state capitol building in downtown Olympia, built of Wilkeson and Tenino sandstone and still in use as a state office building.

The present magnificent capitol, built at a cost of seven million dollars, was first occupied in the closing days of the 1927 session. The 1929 session was the first to convene in the present chambers.
