Introduction

This Legislative Handbook of the Fifty-fifth Legislature for the 1997 session contains pictures and biographical material on state elected officials and members of the Senate and House of Representatives. Additionally, there are sections of the handbook on Americans with Disabilities Act, how a bill becomes law, parking and tour information, and a campus map.

This handbook is prepared by the Senate and the House of Representatives to assist those interested in becoming better acquainted with their statewide elected officials, legislators and the legislative process in

our state.



GARY LOCKE Governor

Gary Locke, the first Asian-American governor in the continental United States, was born in 1950 in Seattle and grew up in Yesler Terrace, a public housing project for the low-income and families of World War II veterans. He received his undergraduate degree from Yale University in 1972 and his law degree from Boston University in 1975.

Locke was elected in November 1996 as Washington's 21st governor and took office on Jan. 15, 1997. Prior to his election, he served as chief executive of King County, the largest county in Washington and the 13th

largest in the nation.

Education is the top priority of the Locke Administration. The governor's goals are to improve the quality of Washington's public schools, colleges and universities, and to ensure that every citizen has access to a high-quality education. The governor is also committed to improving the state's economic climate -including tax policy, environmental protection, growth management and regulatory reform. As one of the nation's leading Asian-American elected officials, Locke is committed to expanding and opening new markets in the Pacific Rim and other regions for Washington products and commodities.

Locke was elected county executive in 1993. During his term, he reduced the size of county government, established a savings incentive program that rewarded agencies for saving money, developed a nationally acclaimed growth management plan, streamlined the construction

permit process and expanded bus service.

Prior to his election as county executive, Locke served 11 years in the Washington House of Representatives. He served on the House Judiciary and Appropriations committees, and for his final five years in the Legislature was chairman of the Appropriations Committee and was responsible for helping to write state budgets.

After he received his law degree, Locke worked as a deputy prosecuting attorney handling major criminal cases. He also has worked as a

community relations manager for US West.

Locke and his wife, Mona Lee Locke, a former news reporter for KING Television in Seattle, have been married for about two years and are expecting their first child in March 1997.



BRAD OWEN Lieutenant Governor

Democrat. Prior to his election as Lieutenant Governor he served four years as Finance Commissioner for the City of Shelton, six in the House of Representatives, and fourteen years in the Washington State Senate. Lieutenant Governor Owen is a prominent member of his community and was a small businessman for twenty-two years. He is a member of the Governor's Council on Substance Abuse, and a member of the Board of Trustees for the Washington State Substance Abuse Council. Lieutenant Governor Owen founded, and is the President of Strategies for Youth, a drug and alcohol awareness education program that he presents in schools throughout the State of Washington.



RALPH MUNRO Secretary of State

Republican. First elected in 1980, serving fifth term as 13th Secretary of State of Washington. Past President of the National Association of Secretaries of State. Lifelong resident of Washington; born and raised on Bainbridge Island. Graduate of Western Washington University. Was Special Assistant to Gov. Dan Evans and Washington's first volunteer coordinator. Served as Director of Guardianship Program at the Foundation for the Handicapped; founded several organizations for the disabled. Active in elections reform, voter outreach, historic preservation, environmental protection and international trade development. Munro, his wife, Karen, and son, George, make their home in Olympia.



MICHAEL J. MURPHY State Treasurer

Democrat. Elected in 1996. He is third in line of succession to the governor. Chairman of the State Finance Committee and Public Deposit Protection Commission. Member of the State Investment Board. Served nine and a half years as the elected County Treasurer of Thurston County beginning in 1987. The immediate past president of Washington Municipal Treasurers' Association (WMTA) and President of the Washington State Association of County Treasurer's. A lifelong resident of Washington, he and his wife, Teri, live in Olympia.



BRIAN SONNTAG State Auditor

Democrat. He was elected in 1992 as Washington's eighth Auditor and was reelected in 1996. Under his leadership, the Office has become a strong advocate for greater government ability. He has been in public service for 24 years, and was elected Pierce County Clerk in 1978. Eight years later, Brian was elected County Auditor. Presently, he serves on the state Productivity Board as a gubernatorial appointee. Brian also serves on the Performance Audit Task Force of the National State Auditors Association to help develop strategies for measuring the performance and efficiency of state governments. Brian holds a professional certification as a Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM) by the Association of Government Accountants. He attended Tacoma Community College and the University of Puget Sound, and completed a graduate program in public affairs at the University of Washington. Brian serves on the boards of United Way and the Boys and Girls Clubs, is a YMCA volunteer and coaches youth baseball and basketball. He enjoys weight lifting, baseball and his family.



CHRISTINE O. GREGOIRE

Attorney General
Democrat. Now in her second term, Christine Gregoire is Washington's first woman to serve as state Attorney General. Lifelong resident of Washington. Raised in Auburn. A graduate of the University of Washington, she received her law degree from Gonzaga Law School. She became an Assistant Attorney General in 1977 and in 1981 became a Senior Assistant Attorney General in charge of the Spokane office. She later became the first woman to serve as Deputy Attorney General. In 1988 Gregoire was appointed Director of the Washington State Department of Ecology where she served on the Puget Sound Water Quality Authority. Chris and her husband, Mike, have two daughters and live in Olympia.



TERESA "TERRY" BERGESON, Ph. D. Superintendent of Public Instruction

Nonpartisan Office. Serving her first term. Terry began her career as a teacher and junior high school guidance counselor, working in Massachusetts, Alaska, and Washington. In 1985, she was elected President of the Washington Education Association, during which time she promoted the association's commitment to children and public education. She was hired in 1989 as an Executive Director of the Central Kitsap School District, where she supervised nine schools and several special programs. In 1993, Terry was appointed Executive Director of the Washington Commission on Student Learning, which is developing statewide standards for students and a series of tests students must pass prior to graduation. Terry has a B.A. in English, a Master's in Counseling and Guidance, and a Ph. D. in Education. Throughout her career, Terry has focused on what is best for students and has worked tirelessly to build partnerships between Legislators, educators, parents, and community leaders.



JENNIFER M. BELCHER Commissioner of Public Lands

Democrat. Serving her second term. The Commissioner administers the Department of Natural Resources, the state's management agency for forest, agricultural, range, tidal and shore lands. Chair of Board of Natural Resources; Forest Practices Board; and Harbor Lines Commission and current president of the Western States Lands Commissioner's Association. Jennifer served five terms as State Representative from District 22, was Chair of the House Natural Resources and Parks Committee from 1988-1992 and was a member of the Appropriations, Judiciary, and Revenue Committees. She is an active member of the community, serving on various Boards of Directors, and was previously president of her own management consulting firm.



DEBORAH SENN Insurance Commissioner

Democrat. The state's seventh Insurance Commissioner and the first woman elected to the office. Now in her second term, she has underscored her longtime commitment to consumer protection and greater access to insurance through strong regulatory oversight. Commissioner Senn has focused on consumer concerns in auto, home, and life insurance, and she has implemented tough new financial requirements for insurance companies. In health insurance, she is working for stronger consumer protection and quality-of-care standards in an era of managed care. Commissioner Senn and her husband, Rudi, live in Seattle and enjoy hiking, skiing and mountain climbing.

Graduate Portland State College and Oregon State College with Masters in Education and minor in Political Science. Past President Community Club, PTA, Vancouver Education Association. Member: Kiwanis, Grange, American Legion and Salmon Creek Methodist Church. He and his wife, Patricia, have three children: Sue, Jim and Nancy.



BENTON, DON
Republican. Represents the 17th District encompassing Eastern Clark County and Western Skamania. A self-employed business owner, Don lives in Vancouver with his wife, Mary and four children. His company, The Benton Group, conducts sales training and management consulting for television, radio and cable companies world-wide. Don holds a B.S. degree in management and communication and is an advertising and marketing expert. He is a Clark County Red Cross board member and also a former community college trustee. Don is vice chair of Financial Institutions, Insurance and Housing and Transportation committees and serves on the Health and Long-Term Care and Rules committees.



BROWN, LISA J.

Democrat. Senator from the 3rd Legislative District, Spokane. Serving her first term as Senator, having served four years in the House of Representatives. Senator Brown is on the Ways and Means and Energy and Utilities committees. She is an Associate Professor of Economics at Eastern Washington University. She holds a Ph.D and M.A. in Economics from the University of Colorado and a B.A. from the University of Illinois. Active in a number of community organizations, including Spokane Neighborhood Action Programs and the Spokane Aids Network. She has one child, Lucas. They enjoy reading, Legos, and bicycling.



DECCIO, ALEX A.

Republican. Senator from the 14th Legislative District, covering Yakima, Selah, Union Gap and other parts of Yakima County. Serving his fourth term as State Senator since 1981. Chair of the Senate Health and Long-Term Care Committee; and Vice Chair of the Senate Ways and Means Committee. Previous public service includes State Representative from 1975-1981 and Yakima County Commissioner from 1989-1992. Very active in Yakima civic activities, including the Visitors and Convention Bureau Board, Providence Medical Center Community Board, and the Yakima Neighborhood Health Services Board. Named Yakima Person of the Year in 1988. Deccio and his wife, Lucille, have eight children and thirteen grandchildren.



FAIRLEY, DARLENE

Democrat. Senator from the 32nd District of King County. She is serving her first term in the Senate. Member of the Health and Long-Term Care, and ranking Democrat member of the Law and Justice Committee. Born and raised in Seattle, Darlene earned a B.A. in Political Science from the University of Washington and has completed graduate work in International Management and International Relations. Small business owner with a long history of community service. Served as Lake Forest Park City Councilwoman, a court-appointed special advocate for abused children, and a volunteer victim advocate for the Seattle Police Department. FINKBEINER, BILL

Republican. Senator from the 45th District including Woodinville, Duvall, Carnation and parts of Kirkland and Redmond. Bill is serving his first term in the Senate following one term as a member of the House of Representatives. Bill is the Chair of Energy and Utilities Committee, Vice Chair of the Education Committee and a member of the Financial Institutions, Insurance and Housing Committee. Bill is a lifelong Washington State resident and a graduate of Lake Washington High School and Whitman College. Bill, his wife Kristin and their son, Connor, live in Carnation.



FRANKLIN, ROSA Democratic Whip

Democrat. Senator from the 29th Legislative District, Pierce County, which includes South Tacoma, Parkland, McChord Air Base Manitou and McKinley Hill. Rosa relinquished a forty-two year diverse nursing career since becoming a legislator. Former State Representative, Thurston County Commissioner and Mayor of Lacey. Past President of the Washington State Association of Counties. Graduate of University of Washington with B.A. and M.P.A degrees. Co-Chair, Legislative International Caucus. Married to Tim Malone, retired Assistant Attorney General. They have an adopted daughter, Hiromi.



GOINGS, CALVIN Democratic Assistant Floor Leader

Democrat. Senator from the 25th Legislative District, representing the cities of Puyallup, Sumner, Edgewood, Milton, Pacific, and the communities of Summit/South Hill and Alderton/McMillin. A lifelong resident of Puyallup, he has served in the Senate since 1995. Also serves as an elected Pierce Co. Fire Commissioner. A graduate of Pierce College and Pacific Lutheran University. Works as a bank personnel supervisor on South Hill. Is a member of the Bd. of Directors of the Eastern Pierce Co. Chamber of Commerce and is a member of the Pierce College Foundation Bd. of Trustees, is the President-elect of the American Heart Assoc.- Eastern Pierce Co. Chapter, and a past member of the Pierce Co. Sheriff's Dept. Citizen Advisory Bd. Serves on the Education, Law and Justice, and Transportation committees.



HALE, PATRICIA S. Majority Whip

Republican. Pat serves the citizens of the 8th District which encompasses most of Benton County, including Richland and Kennewick. Pat is manager of community relations for Fluor Daniel Hanford. Pat moved to the Tri-Cities in 1983, ran her own small business before joining Westinghouse at Hanford. In 1990, she became Washington State's first recipient of the Westinghouse Electric Corporation's National Management Award for Total Quality Achievement. Pat is active in the community and currently serves on the Boards of Directors for the United Way and the Tri-Cities Visitor and Convention Bureau. HARGROVE, JAMES E.

Democrat. Senator from the 24th District: Clallam, Jefferson and western Grays Harbor Counties. He served four terms in the House and is currently serving his second term in the Senate. Jim was born in Portland, Oregon and graduated with a B.S. in Forestry Management from Oregon State University. He is self-employed as a forester on the Olympic Peninsula. Jim and his wife, Laurie, and three children live in Hoquiam and are active members of the local Christian community. Jim's legislative work emphasizes trade/economic development and natural resources management from a rural community perspective.



HAUGEN, MARY MARGARET

Democrat. Senator from the 10th District, representing all of Island County, parts of Snohomish and Skagit. Currently serving her second term in Senate, she has served five terms in the House of Representatives. Mary Margaret is the Ranking Democrat of the Transportation Committee, member of Law and Justice and Government Operations committees. Chair of Municipal Research Council, Member of Law and Justice Planning Council, Community Development Block Grant Advisory Committee, Historical Records Advisory Board, Legislative Transportation Committee. Member of Eastern Star, S. Camano Grange, Stanwood/Camano Soroptomists, League Women Voters and United Methodist Church. Lifetime resident of Camano Island. Mary Margaret is married, has four grown children and five grandchildren.



HEAVEY, MICHAEL

Democrat. Senator from the 34th District: King County - West Seattle, Burien, and Vashon Island. Mike is an attorney in private practice; Vietnam Veteran (awarded the Bronze Star); involved in numerous community activities; former Community Council President. Served four terms in House of Representatives. Mike is a native Washingtonian and a graduate of Seattle public schools, University of Washington and Santa Clara University. Mike is married and has three children.



HOCHSTATTER, HAROLD

Republican. Senator from the 13th Legislative District, which includes parts of Grant, Adams, Kittitas and Yakima Counties. Harold is a graduate of Moses Lake schools and WSU. He is part owner of an electrical contracting firm. He also owns Keller Quay, a residential plat of twenty lots. Harold enjoys reading, sailing and the outdoors. He is a Christian and a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church.



HORN, JIM

Republican. Senator from 41st District which includes Mercer Island, downtown and southern Bellevue, Newcastle, areas of unincorporated King County and northeastern Renton. First term in the Senate after four terms in the House of Representatives. Born and raised in central Illinois. B.S. in Mech. Engr. from Univ. of Illinois. Graduate studies at SMU. Four term Mercer Island City Councilman and past Mayor. Served 31 years in management of space and military programs with Boeing. Active in many community activities, including Eastside Sexual Assault Center for Children, Lions and VFW. He and wife, Joyce, have two grown children, Brad and Lisa, and three granddaughters, Nicole, Brittney, and Lindsey.



IACOBSEN, KEN

Democrat. 46th District, NE Seattle. Serving first term in the Senate after serving seven terms in the House of Representatives. Born in Dannebrog, Nebraska, of postcard from Nebraska fame. Raised in NE Seattle. Attended Lake City Elementary, Shoreline High School, University of Washington and Teachers' College, New Zealand. Involved in Dollars for Scholars; Friends of the University of Washington Library; the American Indian Endowment Committee and the Seattle Audubon Society. Married to a New Zealander, Rachel; with two American teenagers, Sonja and Kiri. Hobby: Hummingbird and butterfly gardening.



JOHNSON, STEPHEN L. Majority Floor Leader

Republican. First term Senator from the 47th District; encompassing southeast King County from the Renton Highlands to Kent to Black Diamond. Senator Johnson is a senior partner in the Kent law firm of Curran, Kleweno & Johnson and a former Kent School Board member. He holds a former Kent School board member. He holds a Bachelor's degree from Whitman College and a Law degree from the University of Washington. He is Majority Floor Leader and serves on the committees of Education; Law and Justice; and Rules. Steve and his wife, Lynn, have two grown children, Jennifer Smith and Tom Johnson.



KLINE, ADAM


SHEAHAN, LARRY

How A Bill Becomes A Law

A bill may be introduced in either the Senate or House of Representatives, but the procedure by which a bill becomes a law is much the same, wherever the bill originates.

In this story, the bill is introduced in the Senate by a member, or members, of that body. After the bill is filed with the Secretary of the Senate, it is given a number and, unless a majority demands it be read in full, it is read the first time by title only in open session of the Senate. It is then referred to a standing committee of the Senate.

- The committee studies the bill and often holds public hearings on it. The committee will then meet to consider the information it has gathered. It may approve the bill with or without amendments, draft a new bill on the same subject incorporating the desired changes, or take no action.
- 3. The committee is now ready to report back to the Senate. If the majority is in favor of the bill as introduced or with certain amendments, the chair recommends the bill for passage. The committee report is read in open session of the Senate, and the bill is then referred to the Rules Committee.
- 4. After the bill has been recommended for passage by the standing committee to which it was originally referred, the Rules Committee can either place it on the second reading calendar for debate before the entire body, or take no action.
- 5. When the bill appears on the calendar for second reading, it is subject to amendment. It is then returned to the Rules Committee where it must receive a favorable vote before being placed on the third reading calendar for final passage. This referral to Rules is often bypassed by vote of the Senate and the bill placed on final passage immediately following its second reading. Depending upon the degree of controversy, debate may last a few minutes to several hours—or even several days.
- After passing in the Senate, the bill will go through an almost identical procedure in the House.

If the bill is passed by the House, but is amended by that body, the Senate must concur in the amendments. If the Senate does not accept the change in the bill, a conference committee may be requested on the differences.

- 7. If the conference committee cannot agree, a conference committee may be appointed with power to rewrite the amendment or even write an entirely new bill. When the conferees reach agreement, they report to their respective houses. Their report is either accepted or rejected without any changes.
- If the report is accepted by both houses, the bill is signed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House in open sessions of each body, and then is sent for the governor's signature.
- 9. Within five days, if the Legislature is still is session, or 20 days after its adjournment, the governor may sign the bill or veto all or any section of it. The Legislature can override the veto by a two-thirds vote of both houses. If the governor fails to act on the bill, it becomes law without a signature.

Visitors Tour Information

Tour Guide program was initiated to benefit both the legislator and the constituent.

Busy legislators frequently find it difficult to be on hand to greet guests arriving from the "home" district. The Tour Office will assign a staff member to meet the visitors and welcome them in the name of the district legislator. Arrangements will be made for a time and place for the legislator to speak with the group or the individual guest. Seating space will be reserved in the House and Senate galleries.

Visitors may be escorted to places of interest on the Capitol Campus: State Library, Temple of Justice, and State Museum. Appointments can be made to visit the offices of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Treas-

urer, Auditor, and Secretary of State.

Requests from constituents often come directly to the Tour Guide Office which then informs the legislators from the district. Many times the request comes first to the legislator who will then call the office with the name of the group and a contact phone number.



State Capitol Parking Information

There are six parking locations available to visitors at the Capitol:

- Visitor Information Center Parking. Located at the Visitor Information Center at 14th and Capitol Way. There is a \$.50 per hour charge. The phone number is (360) 586-3460.
- North and South Diagonal Parking. Located along the North and South Diagonal roads on the Capitol Campus. There is a \$.50 per hour charge. South Diagonal parking is not available for public parking during legislative session.
- 3. General Administration Parking Garage (upper level) off of 11th Avenue. There is a \$.50 per hour charge.
- **4. Natural Resources Building.** Visitor entry is from Washington and 11th. \$.50 per hour charge.
- 5. The Satellite Visitor Parking Lot at Jefferson Street and 16th Avenue (access at Jefferson). Parking is metered and there is a free shuttle bus to the legislative campus which runs every ten minutes, Monday through Friday. Wheelchair accessible. During interim, this parking lot is designated as leased parking only.

- 6. Parking on the Deschutes Parkway along Capitol Lake (for legislative staff only and satellite visitor parking lot overflow). Parking is free and there is a free shuttle bus to the Capitol Campus Monday through Friday (during session only).
- From I-5 Southbound: Take exit 103 and proceed on 2nd Avenue to the Tumwater Fire Station; turn left onto the Custer Way overpass; turn right on Boston, proceed downhill to Deschutes Parkway; turn right (north) onto the Parkway and proceed to the designated parking area along Capitol Lake.
- From I-5 Northbound: Take exit 103 and proceed north on Deschutes Parkway through the stop sign to the designated parking area along Capitol Lake. For more information, call the Visitor Information Center at (360) 586-3460.
